Information About PA Day and March Break Programming

The Centre for Behavioural Studies at St. Lawrence College will be running programming for PA days and March Break programming for all children including children with ASDs, ADHD, developmental disabilities and children with other learning needs. During these days, we will offer a variety of activities to facilitate learning in the areas of social and emotional development, play and leisure skills, and life/self help skills for children ages 4-18. cbs@sl.on.ca

When and how long is programming for?

Programming will be available on PA days for Limestone District School Board and Algonquin Lakeshore Catholic District School Board PA days (November 30, 2019, February 1, 2019, April 5, 2019, May 17, 2019 and June 28, 2019) and during the March Break (March 11-15, 2019). Programming will run from 8:30 am -4:30pm each day. These sessions will include a variety of activities and potentially some outings but snacks and meals are not provided.

Where is the Centre for Behavioural Studies?

A completely renovated, purpose built and accessible clinic space is located in the Newcourt House Building on the corner of King Street and Country Club Drive (southwest corner of the college campus, near the residences).

Who is providing programming?

Students from our behavioural programs (Autism & Behavioural Science Graduate Certificate program, the Honours Bachelor of Behavioural Psychology program, and the Behavioural Science Program) will be delivering the programming under the guidance and supervision of a Behaviour Therapist or Clinical Supervisor. Note that students may run some of the programming independently.

How much does it cost?

Each day of programming is \$60. You do not need to commit to the full week for March Break and you can choose as many PA Days as required.

Who is eligible for this program?

Children ages 4-18 without exceptional challenging behaviours, and those who can attend group programming without one-to-one support are eligible. Children will be grouped by age and programming will be tailored to meet the needs and interest of each group of children.
